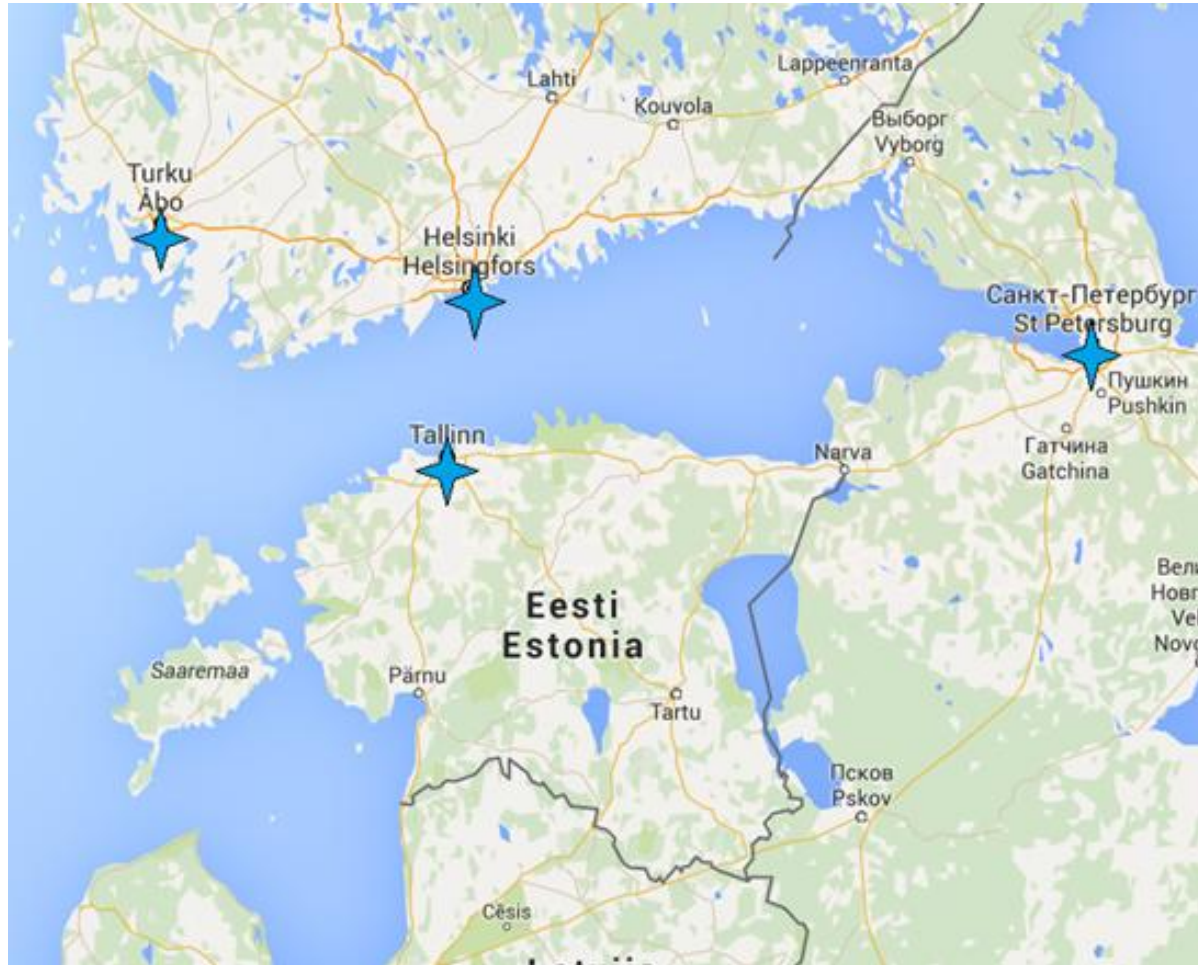
- Since 1991 – the oldest environmental campaign in town.

- Duration 1 month until Tallinn Day – 15th May



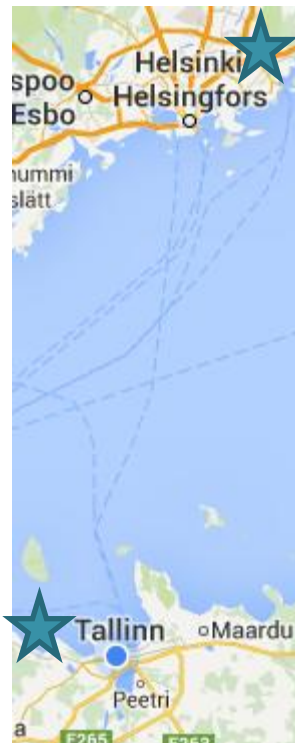

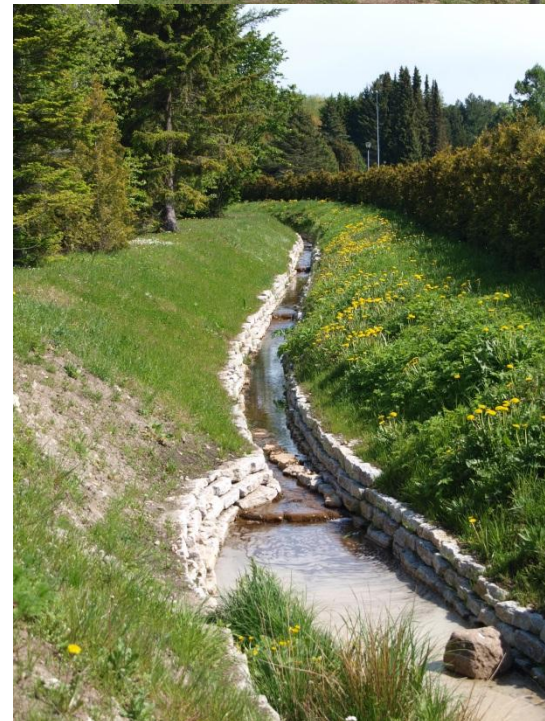
